Services to Families

- Dedicated Court and Community Team
- Provides parent/child assessments and interventions that help troubled relationships
- Assists the court in making timely decisions regarding safe permanent homes for these children
- Provides an expanded array of developmental, medical and mental health services
- Intensive supportive services with monthly court reviews
- Training provided to our community on topics related to Infant/Toddler mental health



Who is Eligible?

- Available to child welfare clients with children ages birth to three
- Parent(s) who are willing to participate in and collaborate with child-centered services

This service is available to a limited number of families in order to provide the necessary intensive, coordinated services.

What is the Coos County Zero to Three Court Program?

The Zero to Three Court Program is a collaborative pilot project based on court/community partnerships that applies research to court practices to improve outcomes for maltreated infants, toddlers and their families.

Program Goals:

- Improve outcomes for infants and toddlers in the foster care system
- Decrease inter-generational recurrence of abuse and/or neglect
- Enhance and better coordinate services for these children and their families
- Reduce the number of placements and obtain permanency sooner for infants and toddlers
